

PETP (Personal Educational Technology Project) Guide

Project Overview

This is your opportunity to explore educational technology in a way that is personally relevant and professionally useful. Your PETP should reflect your interests, skill set, and teaching context. The goal is to create a transformative, tech-enhanced product or resource that you can apply in your current or future work.

Step 1: Brainstorm & Identify Your Focus

Reflect on one or more of the following:

- What teaching challenge or opportunity could tech help you with?
- Is there a lesson, unit, or course you'd like to enhance with tech?
- Are there tools or platforms you've wanted to explore more deeply?
- Would a video, website, guide, or multimedia resource help your students or colleagues?

Write 2–3 ideas and choose the strongest one.

Step 2: Project Proposal

Submit your proposal by: June 5th

Include the following in your proposal (1–2 pages or short slide deck):

- Project Title
- Project Description (What are you creating? Why?)
- Audience/Context (Who is this for?)
- Technologies/Tools to be used
- Expected Outcomes/Deliverables
- How it supports your teaching goals

Step 4: Develop & Reflect

Keep track of your process:

- What worked well?
- What was hard or unexpected?
- What would you do differently next time?

You may include this reflection as part of the presentation in Week 16.

Final Submission & Presentation

Due: June 19

Final submission include:

- Your finished product (video, website, lesson plan, toolkit, etc.) - digital file, link, etc.
- A 5-10 minute presentation or demo (in class)
